Business Center. Most specifically,
the Loop refers to an area bounded
by the CTA 'L' tracks. In general use
it refers to the core of central
business district, which is the
second largest in the United States
after Midtown Manhattan.

Skyscrapers dominate Loop architecture, which include the Chicago Board of Trade, Willis Tower, and the Lyric Opera House. This area also offers numerous shopping opportunities, such as the historic State Street Shopping District. Numerous government buildings are also within the Loop, including City Hall, the James R. Thompson Center and multiple federal buildings.

## **Yellow Line Overview**
